## **HOUSE BILL 1128**

- 1 (b) Within 30 days after receiving the results of each quarterly test, if the results 2 indicate that a contaminant is present, the Commission shall:
- 3 (1) report the results of the test to the county executives of Montgomery 4 County and Prince George's County; and
- 5 (2) publish the results of the test on its Web site.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2016.
