

A BILL ENTITLED

1	AN ACT concerning
2 3	Law Enforcement Officers – Entrance–Level and In–Service Training Requirements – Mental Health Issues
$4\\5\\6\\7$	FOR the purpose of requiring the Police Training Commission to require that certain entrance—level and in—service training conducted by the State and each county and municipal police training school include certain training concerning mental health issues; and generally relating to law enforcement officers.
8 9 10 11 12	BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Public Safety Section 3–207 Annotated Code of Maryland (2011 Replacement Volume and 2015 Supplement)
13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15	Article - Public Safety
16	3–207.
17 18	Subject to the authority of the Secretary, the Commission has the following powers and duties:
19 20 21	(1) to establish standards for the approval and continuation of approval of schools that conduct police entrance—level and in—service training courses required by the Commission, including State, regional, county, and municipal training schools;
22	(2) to approve and issue certificates of approval to police training schools;
23	(3) to inspect police training schools:





- 1 (10) to make a continuous study of entrance—level and in—service training 2 methods and procedures;
- 3 (11) to consult with and accept the cooperation of any recognized federal, 4 State, or municipal law enforcement agency or educational institution;
- 5 (12) to consult and cooperate with universities, colleges, and institutions in 6 the State to develop specialized courses of study for police officers in police science and 7 police administration;
- 8 (13) to consult and cooperate with other agencies and units of the State 9 concerned with police training;
- 10 (14) to develop, with the cooperation of the Office of the Chief Medical 11 Examiner and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, a uniform missing person report form 12 to be available for use by each law enforcement agency of the State on or before October 1, 13 2008;
- 14 (15) to require, for entrance-level police training and annually for in-service level police training conducted by the State and each county and municipal police training school, that the curriculum and minimum courses of study include, for police officers who are issued an electronic control device by a law enforcement agency, special training in the proper use of electronic control devices, as defined in § 4–109 of the Criminal Law Article, consistent with established law enforcement standards and federal and State constitutional provisions;
- 21 (16) to require, for entrance-level police training and, as determined by the 22 Commission, for in-service level training conducted by the State and each county and 23 municipal police training school, that the curriculum and minimum courses of study 24 include, consistent with established law enforcement standards and federal and State 25 constitutional provisions:
- 26 (i) training in lifesaving techniques, including Cardiopulmonary 27 Resuscitation (CPR);
- 28 (ii) training in the proper level and use of force;
- 29 (iii) training regarding sensitivity to cultural and gender diversity; 30 and
- 31 (iv) training regarding individuals with physical, intellectual, 32 developmental, and psychiatric disabilities;
- 33 (17) TO REQUIRE, FOR ENTRANCE-LEVEL POLICE TRAINING AND, AS
 34 DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION, FOR IN-SERVICE LEVEL TRAINING CONDUCTED
 35 BY THE STATE AND EACH COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL, THAT

- 1 THE CURRICULUM AND MINIMUM COURSES OF STUDY INCLUDE TRAINING 2 CONCERNING MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES THAT IS:
- 3 (I) DEVELOPED IN CONSULTATION WITH MENTAL HEALTH 4 PROFESSIONALS AND THEIR PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS; AND
- 5 (II) CONDUCTED BY A MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL;
- 6 (18) to develop, with the cooperation of the Office of the Attorney General, 7 the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention, and the Federal Trade Commission, 8 a uniform identity fraud reporting form that:
- 9 (i) makes transmitted data available on or before October 1, 2011, 10 for use by each law enforcement agency of State and local government; and
- 11 (ii) may authorize the data to be transmitted to the Consumer 12 Sentinel program in the Federal Trade Commission; and
- [(18)] (19) to perform any other act that is necessary or appropriate to carry out the powers and duties of the Commission under this subtitle.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
