BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Alcoholic Beverages Section 2–207 Annotated Code of Maryland (As enacted by Chapter \_\_\_\_ (S.B. \_\_\_\_)(6lr1406) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2016) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Alcoholic Beverages 2-207.There is a Class 5 brewery license.
