- 1 (b) (1) All dispensing equipment for motor fuel shall be marked conspicuously 2 to show in numerals of equal size the price, including taxes, of a gallon of the motor fuel 3 offered for sale.
- 4 (2) If numerals that show a fractional cent are used, the combined height 5 and width of the numerator and denominator shall equal the height and width of the other 6 numerals used.
- 7 (3) A STICKER THAT THE COMPTROLLER REQUIRES TO BE AFFIXED
 8 TO DISPENSING EQUIPMENT FOR MOTOR FUEL SHALL INCLUDE THE ADDRESS OF A
 9 WEB SITE MAINTAINED BY THE COMPTROLLER WHERE THE CURRENT FEDERAL AND
 10 STATE MOTOR FUEL TAX RATES MAY BE VIEWED.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
