- $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of increasing the annual license fees for certain alcoholic beverages 6 licenses in Prince George's County; repealing the special Sunday "on-sale" permit 7 attached to the Class B beer, wine, and liquor license; altering the maximum number 8 of certain licenses that may be issued in the County; altering the hour at which a 9 holder of a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license may begin to sell beer, wine, and 10 liquor; making certain technical changes; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Prince George's County. 11
