- $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of authorizing the Prince George's County Board of License 6 Commissioners to issue a certain number of Class B–DD (Development District) 7licenses to restaurants located in a certain area within the area of Riverdale Park 8 Station; authorizing the Board to issue a certain number of Class B-DD 9 (Development District) licenses to restaurants located within the area of Riverdale 10 Park Town Center; providing that a certain number of Sunday off-sale permits may 11 be issued only to holders of a certain license who acquired the license on or after a 12certain date; altering the number of Sunday off-sale permits that may be in effect at 13 any one time; requiring the Board to waive a certain reinvestment requirement 14 under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the issuance of Class B-DD 15(Development District) alcoholic beverages licenses to restaurants and permits in 16 Prince George's County.
