- 1 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 2 (d) "Permit" means a permit issued by the Secretary to carry, wear, or transport 3 a handgun.
- 4 5–304.
- 5 (b) (1) Subject to subsections (c) and (d) of this section, the Secretary may 6 charge a nonrefundable fee payable when an application is filed for a permit.
- 7 (d) The Secretary may not charge a fee under subsection (b) of this section to:
- 8 (2) a retired law enforcement officer of the State or a county or municipal or corporation of the State.

- 11 (a) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A permit 12 expires on the last day of the holder's birth month following 2 years after the date the 13 permit is issued.
- 14 (b) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A permit
  15 may be renewed for successive periods of 3 years each if, at the time of an application for
  16 renewal, the applicant possesses the qualifications for the issuance of a permit and pays
  17 the renewal fee stated in this subtitle.
- 18 (C) (1) A PERMIT ISSUED TO A RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF 19 THE STATE OR A COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE:
- 20 (I) EXPIRES ON THE LAST DAY OF THE HOLDER'S BIRTH MONTH 21 FOLLOWING 5 YEARS AFTER THE DATE THE PERMIT IS ISSUED; AND
- 22 (II) MAY BE RENEWED FOR SUCCESSIVE PERIODS OF **5** YEARS 23 EACH IF, AT THE TIME OF AN APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL, THE APPLICANT POSSESSES THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A PERMIT.
- 25 (2) A RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THE STATE OR A
  26 COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE WHO APPLIES FOR THE
  27 RENEWAL OF A PERMIT IS NOT REQUIRED TO BE FINGERPRINTED UNLESS THE
  28 SECRETARY REQUIRES A SET OF THE OFFICER'S FINGERPRINTS TO RESOLVE A
  29 QUESTION OF THE OFFICER'S IDENTITY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
