A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland College Collaboration for Student Veterans Commission

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland College Collaboration for Student Veterans 4 Commission; providing for the membership and appointment and terms of members of the Commission; requiring the Commission to elect the chair, vice chair, and $\mathbf{5}$ 6 secretary each year; requiring the Commission to meet a certain number of times 7 each year; providing that a member of the Commission may not receive certain 8 compensation, but may receive reimbursement for certain expenses under certain 9 regulations; providing for the duties of the Commission; and generally relating to the 10 Maryland College Collaboration for Student Veterans Commission.

4 (B) "COLLEGE COLLABORATION" MEANS THE MARYLAND COLLEGE 5 COLLABORATION FOR STUDENT VETERANS, MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING 6 BETWEEN THE STATE AND MARYLAND INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION 7 DATED JANUARY 31, 2011.

8 (C) "COMMISSION" MEANS THE MARYLAND COLLEGE COLLABORATION 9 FOR STUDENT VETERANS COMMISSION.

13 **9–951.**

14 (A) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

15(1) THE SECRETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS, OR THE SECRETARY'S16DESIGNEE;

17(2)THE SECRETARY OF HIGHER EDUCATION, OR THE SECRETARY'S18DESIGNEE; AND

19(3) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF ANY INSTITUTION OF HIGHER20EDUCATION IN THE STATE THAT ELECTS TO PARTICIPATE.

(B) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION FROM A LIST OF THREE QUALIFIED
 INDIVIDUALS SUBMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR BY THE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER
 EDUCATION SEEKING TO BE REPRESENTED ON THE COMMISSION.

25 (C) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 2 YEARS.

26(2)AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL27A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

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1 THE COMMISSION SHALL ELECT ANNUALLY A CHAIR, A VICE CHAIR, AND A 2 SECRETARY FROM AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION.

3 **9–953.**

4 (A) THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES EACH YEAR.

5 (B) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:

6 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 7 COMMISSION; BUT

8 (2) MAY RECEIVE REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 9 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

11 **THE COMMISSION SHALL:**

12 (1) WORK TO ENSURE THE EDUCATIONAL SUCCESS OF RETURNING 13 VETERANS, INCLUDING THEIR RECRUITMENT, SUCCESSFUL TRANSITION INTO 14 HIGHER EDUCATION, RETENTION, AND EVENTUAL GRADUATION;

15 (2) FACILITATE THE SHARING OF BEST PRACTICES AMONG 16 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND STATE AGENCIES REGARDING 17 ACADEMIC TRANSITION PROGRAMS AND SUPPORT SERVICES DESIGNED FOR 18 RETURNING VETERANS;

19 (3) WORK WITH INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE 20 TO PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING SERVICES TO VETERANS, AS SET FORTH IN THE 21 COLLEGE COLLABORATION:

(I) AWARENESS OF VETERAN REINTEGRATION CHALLENGES;

23(II) COMMUNICATION AND COORDINATION OF AVAILABLE24VETERAN SERVICES;

25 (III) A DESIGNATED "ONE DOOR" OFFICE THAT COORDINATES 26 VETERAN SERVICES AND SUPPORTS;

- 27 (IV) BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES;
- 28 (V) FINANCIAL AID AND GI BILL SUPPORT SERVICES; AND

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1 (VI) PEER SUPPORT GROUPS; AND

2 (4) PUBLISH AN ANNUAL REPORT AND ANY OTHER MATERIAL THE 3 COMMISSION CONSIDERS NECESSARY.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2016.
