#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Veterinarians, Pharmacies, and Pharmacists – Dispensing Compounded Preparations for Use by Companion Animals

4 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice of veterinary medicine" to include  $\mathbf{5}$ the practice of any person who dispenses compounded nonsterile or sterile 6 preparations under certain circumstances; providing an exception to a certain 7 prohibition on the practice of veterinary medicine and dispensing certain medication 8 for a licensed veterinarian who dispenses certain compounded preparations to be 9 used for a companion animal; providing that certain provisions of law do not prohibit a licensed veterinarian from dispensing, in accordance with a certain provision of 10 11 this Act, certain compounded preparations provided by a certain pharmacy; 12authorizing a certain pharmacy to provide certain compounded preparations without 13 a patient-specific prescription to a certain licensed veterinarian; authorizing a 14 pharmacist to provide certain compounded preparations without a patient-specific prescription to a certain licensed veterinarian under certain circumstances; 1516providing that a certain subtitle does not affect a certain person while distributing 17certain compounded preparations; defining certain terms; making a stylistic change; 18 repealing an obsolete provision of law; making a technical correction; and generally 19relating to veterinarians, pharmacies, pharmacists, and dispensing compounded 20preparations for use by companion animals.
