1 AN ACT concerning

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Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Service Rates

PG/MC 119–16

- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission to $\mathbf{5}$ establish certain customer classes for certain service rates or charges; requiring that 6 service rates for each customer class shall be chargeable against certain properties 7 and shall be uniform for a given class throughout the Washington Suburban 8 Sanitary District; requiring that the minimum or ready to serve charge include a 9 certain component; altering the methods by which the minimum or ready to serve 10 charge and the service charge for water used may be based; and generally relating 11 to the service rates of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission.
