1 AN ACT concerning

2 Anne Arundel County - Property Tax Credit - Blind Individuals and Surviving Spouses

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the governing body of Anne Arundel County and of a 5 municipal corporation in Anne Arundel County to grant, by law, a property tax credit 6 against the county and municipal corporation property tax imposed on certain 7 residential property owned by certain blind individuals or surviving spouses of blind 8 individuals; requiring that a property tax credit authorized by this Act shall be 9 granted in addition to any property tax exemption authorized by law, except under 10 certain circumstances; authorizing the governing body of Anne Arundel County and 11 of a municipal corporation in the county to provide, by law, for regulations, 12 procedures, and any other provisions necessary to administer the tax credit; defining 13 certain terms; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to a 14 property tax credit for certain residential property in Anne Arundel County.
