SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 (a) The operator of a motorcycle may ride the motorcycle only on the permanent 22 and regular seat attached to it.

23 (b) The operator of a motorcycle may not carry any other person unless the 24 motorcycle is designed to carry more than one person, in which event a passenger may ride

on the permanent and regular seat, if designed for two persons, or on another seat firmly
attached to the motorcycle at the rear or side of the operator.

3 (c) A person other than the operator of a motorcycle may not ride on a motorcycle 4 unless the motorcycle is designed to carry more than one person, in which event a passenger 5 may ride on the permanent and regular seat, if designed for 2 persons, or on another seat 6 firmly attached to the motorcycle at the rear or side of the operator.

7 (d) A person may ride on a motorcycle only while sitting astride the seat, facing 8 forward, with one leg on each side of the motorcycle.

9 (e) A person may not operate a motorcycle while carrying any package, bundle, 10 or other article that prevents him from keeping both hands on the handlebars.

11 (f) The operator of a motorcycle may not carry any person in a position that 12 interferes with the operation or control of the motorcycle or the view of the operator.

13 (g) A person other than the operator of a motorcycle may not ride in a position 14 that interferes with the operation or control of the motorcycle or the view of the operator.

15 (H) (1) A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 10 YEARS MAY NOT RIDE ON A 16 MOTORCYCLE.

17 (2) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A PERSON 18 UNDER THE AGE OF 12 YEARS MAY NOT RIDE ON A MOTORCYCLE UNLESS THE 19 PERSON'S FEET ARE ABLE TO REACH AND REST ON THE FOOTRESTS REQUIRED 20 UNDER § 21–1305 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

21 21–1305.

(a) If any motorcycle carries a passenger other than in a sidecar or enclosed cab,
the motorcycle shall be equipped with footrests for the passenger.

24 (b) A person may not operate any motorcycle with handlebars more than 15 25 inches in height above the part of the seat occupied by the operator.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 October 1, 2016.
