Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2016, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One Billion. - (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2016 in the total principal amount of \$1,002,385,000 \$998,686,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §\$ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 8 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a 9 single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
