- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the circumstances under which the Comptroller is required to distribute fees received from the State Board of Physicians to the Office of Student $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Financial Assistance to be used to make grants under the Maryland Loan Assistance 7 Repayment Program for Physicians and Physician Assistants; repealing certain provisions of law that require the Comptroller to distribute certain fees to the Health 8 9 Personnel Shortage Incentive Grant Program under certain circumstances; 10 repealing an obsolete provision of law; and generally relating to the distribution of 11 fees received from the State Board of Physicians by the Comptroller.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
