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Real Property - Senior Apartment Facilities - Conversion

FOR the purpose of requiring a landlord to provide written notice to a certain tenant at least a certain number of days before converting a senior apartment facility into an apartment facility for the general population; specifying the contents of the written notice; requiring a landlord to allow a certain tenant to terminate the tenant's lease after giving at least 1 month's written notice to the landlord, notwithstanding the terms of the lease; prohibiting a landlord from withholding any portion of a certain tenant's security deposit for a certain purpose; requiring a landlord to reimburse the moving expenses of a certain tenant, up to a certain amount and under certain circumstances; authorizing the Secretary of Housing and Community Development to adopt regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act; authorizing the Secretary to impose a certain civil penalty for violations of this Act, beginning on a certain date; providing for the enforcement of certain provisions of this Act by the
