17 18 19 20 21	(c) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a video lottery operation licensee shall ensure that intoxicated individuals and individuals under the age of 21 years are not allowed to play video lottery terminals or table games and are not allowed in areas of the video lottery facility where video lottery terminals or table games are located.
22	(2) A video lottery operation licensee may allow a video lottery employee

who is an adult to enter or remain in an area within the video lottery facility that is designated for table game or video lottery terminal activities if the video lottery employee
