12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 A PERSON IS NOT CRIMINALLY OR CIVILLY LIABLE FOR DAMAGE RESULTING
- 17 FROM THE FORCIBLE ENTRY INTO A MOTOR VEHICLE FOR THE PURPOSE OF
- 18 REMOVING AN ANIMAL FROM THE VEHICLE IF THE PERSON:
- **(1)** 19 DETERMINES THE VEHICLE IS LOCKED OR THERE IS OTHERWISE
- 20 NO REASONABLE METHOD FOR THE ANIMAL TO EXIT THE VEHICLE;
- 21**(2)** HAS A GOOD FAITH AND REASONABLE BELIEF THAT FORCIBLE
- 22 ENTRY INTO THE VEHICLE IS NECESSARY BECAUSE THE ANIMAL IS IN IMMINENT
- 23 DANGER OF SUFFERING HARM IF NOT IMMEDIATELY REMOVED FROM THE VEHICLE;



- 1 (3) HAS MADE A REASONABLE EFFORT TO LOCATE THE OWNER OF 2 THE VEHICLE;
- 3 (4) HAS CONTACTED EITHER THE LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT 4 AGENCY, THE FIRE DEPARTMENT, OR THE 911 OPERATOR BEFORE FORCIBLY 5 ENTERING THE VEHICLE;
- 6 (5) USES NO MORE FORCE TO ENTER THE VEHICLE AND REMOVE THE 7 ANIMAL FROM THE VEHICLE THAN IS NECESSARY UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES;
- 8 (6) PLACES A NOTICE ON THE VEHICLE'S WINDSHIELD THAT
  9 INCLUDES THE PERSON'S CONTACT INFORMATION, THE REASON THE ENTRY WAS
  10 MADE, THE LOCATION OF THE ANIMAL, AND THE FACT THAT THE AUTHORITIES HAVE
  11 BEEN NOTIFIED; AND
- 12 (7) REMAINS WITH THE ANIMAL IN A SAFE LOCATION, OUT OF THE 13 ELEMENTS BUT REASONABLY CLOSE TO THE VEHICLE, UNTIL LAW ENFORCEMENT, 14 FIRE, OR ANOTHER EMERGENCY RESPONDER ARRIVES.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
