Financial Aid – Deaf and Hearing Impaired Students – Out–of–State Institutions of Higher Education

4 FOR the purpose of altering an exception to a certain provision of law that authorizes the 5 use of certain student financial assistance only at a certain institution of higher 6 education in the State; authorizing the use of a Howard P. Rawlings Educational 7 Excellence Award at an institution of higher education that is not in the State if the 8 applicant is a deaf or hearing impaired student attending an institution of higher 9 education that makes certain provisions for deaf and hearing impaired students and comparable provisions are not available to the student at an institution of higher 10 11 education in the State; altering a certain provision of law that prohibits the Office of 12 Student Financial Assistance from awarding more than a certain percent of funds 13 available for certain types of grants for use by students attending certain out-of-state schools; providing for the effective date of this Act; and generally 14 15 relating to State financial aid for deaf and hearing impaired students attending 16 out-of-state institutions of higher education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 Article - Education 18-103. 4 5 Except as otherwise provided in Subtitles 3, 4, 5, and 12 of this title, a scholarship, 6 grant, loan, or other student financial assistance awarded by the Office may be used only 7 at a public or private nonprofit institution of higher education in this State that possesses a certificate of approval from the Commission. 8 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read 10 as follows: Article - Education 11 12 18 - 305.A Delegate Howard P. Rawlings Educational Excellence Award may be used: 13 (a) 14 At a degree granting institution of higher education, an eligible (1) 15 institution with an associate degree program that provides transfer credit for an accredited 16 baccalaureate program, or a hospital diploma school for training registered nurses if the 17 curriculum is approved by the Commission; and 18 (2) For educational expenses as defined by the Commission, including: (i) Tuition and fees; and 19 20 Room and board. (ii) 21 Except as provided in subsection [(c)] (D) of this section, a Delegate Howard 22P. Rawlings Educational Excellence Award may be used at a school in another state if: 23 There is a reciprocal agreement as provided in § 18–308 of this subtitle; (1) 24and 25(2) The school meets requirements of subsection (a)(1) of this section. 26(C) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, A DELEGATE HOWARD P. RAWLINGS EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD MAY BE 27USED AT A DEGREE GRANTING INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT IS NOT IN 28 29 THE STATE IF:

- 1 (1) THE APPLICANT IS A DEAF OR HEARING IMPAIRED STUDENT 2 ATTENDING AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT MAKES SPECIAL 3 PROVISIONS FOR DEAF AND HEARING IMPAIRED STUDENTS; AND
- 4 (2) COMPARABLE SPECIAL PROVISIONS ARE NOT AVAILABLE TO THE 5 STUDENT AT AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE.
- [(c)] (D) The Office may not award more than 10% of the funds available for each of the types of grants awarded under this subtitle for use by students attending schools in another state AND THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.
- 9 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2016, the effective date of Chapter 277 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2011. If the effective date of Chapter 277 is amended, Section 1 of this Act shall take effect on the taking effect of Chapter 277.
- SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2016.
