Children – Family Child Care Homes and Child Care Centers – Advertising and Penalties

4 FOR the purpose of requiring advertisements for certain child care services to include 5 certain information; authorizing certain employees of the State Department of 6 Education or a law enforcement officer to visit and serve a certain civil citation to 7 certain child care homes and child care centers if the child care home or child care 8 center is advertised and is not registered or licensed with the Department; 9 authorizing certain law enforcement officers to serve a certain civil citation to certain 10 child care homes and child care centers in certain circumstances; authorizing the 11 State Fire Marshal, a deputy State fire marshal, or a special assistant State fire 12 marshal to inspect certain child care homes or child care centers under certain 13 circumstances; altering the penalties for providing certain child care services 14 without being registered or licensed; stating the intent of the General Assembly that 15 the Department expand its efforts to educate certain parents and certain child care 16 providers about certain issues relating to child care services; requiring the 17 Department to make a certain report on or before a certain date; defining a certain 18 term; and generally relating to child care services in the State.
