- [(h)](G) At least 14 days before holding a planned promotional event after 6 p.m., a license holder shall file a notice of the promotional event with the Comptroller on the form that the Comptroller provides.
- 8 **[(i)](H)** (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a license 9 holder may not sell or allow to be consumed at the licensed premises any product other 10 than products produced by the license holder under the authority of this section.
- 11 (2) A holder of a caterer's license or privilege under Subtitle 5 of this title 12 or Subtitle 12 of various titles of Division II of this article may exercise the privileges of the 13 license or privilege on the licensed premises of the license holder.
- 14 **[(j)](I)** Nothing in this section limits the application of relevant provisions of 15 Title 21 of the Health General Article, and regulations adopted under that title, to a 16 license holder.
- 17 [(k)](J) The annual license fee is \$2,000.
