## Workers' Compensation Insurance – Premium Discount – Alcohol– and Drug–Free Workplace Program

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring authorizing a workers' compensation insurer to provide file a certain rating plan with the Insurance Commissioner that provides for a certain 5 6 premium discount for certain risks to an insured for that has a certain alcohol- and 7 drug-free workplace policy that may include certain programs instituted and maintained by the insured under certain circumstances; requiring a workers' 8 compensation insurer to provide a certain premium discount to a certain insured 9 that institutes and maintains a policy requiring certain alcohol or drug testing; 10 providing that a certain insurer is not required to provide a certain premium 11 12 discount under certain circumstances; and generally relating to workers' compensation insurance and alcohol—and drug—free workplace programs. 13
