2 (b) A county board of education, described under Title 4, Subtitle 1 of the 3 Education Article, may raise the defense of sovereign immunity to any amount claimed 4 above the limit of its insurance policy or, if self-insured or a member of a pool described 5 under § 4-105(c)(1)(ii) of the Education Article, above [\$100,000] **\$400,000**.

6 (c) A county board of education may not raise the defense of sovereign immunity 7 to any claim of [\$100,000] **\$400,000** or less.

10 (a) (1) Each county board shall carry comprehensive liability insurance to 11 protect the board and its agents and employees.

12 (2) The purchase of [this] insurance IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH
 13 (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION is a valid educational expense.

14 (b) (1) The State Board shall establish standards for these insurance policies, 15 including a minimum liability coverage of not less than [\$100,000] **\$400,000** for each 16 occurrence.

17 (2) The policies purchased under this section shall meet these standards.

18 (c) (1) A county board complies with this section if it:

19 (i) Is individually self-insured for at least [\$100,000] **\$400,000** for 20 each occurrence under the rules and regulations adopted by the State Insurance 21 Commissioner; or

(ii) Pools with other public entities for the purpose of self-insuring
 property or casualty risks under Title 19, Subtitle 6 of the Insurance Article.

24 (2) A county board that elects to self-insure individually under this 25 subsection periodically shall file with the State Insurance Commissioner, in writing, the 26 terms and conditions of the self-insurance.

(3) The terms and conditions of this individual self–insurance:

(i) Are subject to the approval of the State Insurance Commissioner;and

(ii) Shall conform with the terms and conditions of comprehensive
 liability insurance policies available in the private market.

#### **SENATE BILL 575**

1 (d) A county board shall have the immunity from liability described under § 2 5–518 of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to 4 apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or 5 application to any cause of action before the effective date of this Act.

6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2016.
