County Boards of Education – Limit on Liability

- 3 FOR the purpose of increasing the limit on liability of a county board of education;

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

- 22 (b) A county board of education, described under Title 4, Subtitle 1 of the
- 23 Education Article, may raise the defense of sovereign immunity to any amount claimed



above the limit of its insurance policy or, if self-insured or a member of a pool described under § 4-105(c)(1)(ii) of the Education Article, above [\$100,000] \$400,000.

(c) A county board of education may not raise the defense of sovereign immunity

to any claim of [\$100,000] **\$400,000** or less.

- 7 (a) **(1)** Each county board shall carry comprehensive liability insurance to 8 protect the board and its agents and employees.
- 9 (2) The purchase of [this] insurance IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH 10 (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION is a valid educational expense.
- 11 (b) **(1)** The State Board shall establish standards for these insurance policies, including a minimum liability coverage of not less than **[**\$100,000**] \$400,000** for each occurrence.
- 14 **(2)** The policies purchased under this section shall meet these standards.
- 15 (c) (1) A county board complies with this section if it:
- 16 (i) Is individually self—insured for at least [\$100,000] **\$400,000** for each occurrence under the rules and regulations adopted by the State Insurance Commissioner; or
- 19 (ii) Pools with other public entities for the purpose of self–insuring 20 property or casualty risks under Title 19, Subtitle 6 of the Insurance Article.
- 21 (2) A county board that elects to self-insure individually under this 22 subsection periodically shall file with the State Insurance Commissioner, in writing, the 23 terms and conditions of the self-insurance.
- 24 (3) The terms and conditions of this individual self–insurance:
- 25 (i) Are subject to the approval of the State Insurance Commissioner; 26 and
- 27 (ii) Shall conform with the terms and conditions of comprehensive 28 liability insurance policies available in the private market.
- 29 (d) A county board shall have the immunity from liability described under § 30 5–518 of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article.
