A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Public Safety – SWAT Teams – Reporting and Limitations

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Police Training Commission to adopt a certain set of standards for the training and deployment of SWAT teams in the State; requiring 4 $\mathbf{5}$ each law enforcement agency to follow a certain set of standards; requiring, at 6 certain intervals, a law enforcement agency that maintains a SWAT team to report 7 certain information to the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention using 8 a certain format; requiring the Police Training Commission, in consultation with the 9 Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention, to develop a standardized format that certain law enforcement agencies shall use in reporting to the Governor's Office 1011 of Crime Control and Prevention certain data relating to the deployment of SWAT 12teams; requiring the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention to analyze 13 and summarize certain reports of law enforcement agencies and to submit a certain 14report of the analyses and summaries to the Governor, the General Assembly, and 15each law enforcement agency before a certain date each year; providing that, if a law 16enforcement agency fails to comply with the reporting provisions of this Act, the 17Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention shall report the noncompliance to 18 the Commission; requiring the Commission to contact a certain law enforcement 19agency and request that the agency comply with this Act under certain 20circumstances; providing that, if a certain law enforcement agency fails to comply 21with certain reporting provisions within a certain period after being contacted by the 22Commission, the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention and the 23Commission jointly shall make a certain report to the Governor and the Legislative 24Policy Committee of the General Assembly; requiring that, when a SWAT team is 25deployed, one or more members of the SWAT team shall wear a certain uniform; 26defining certain terms; and generally relating to the deployment of SWAT teams.

4 (B) THE POLICE TRAINING COMMISSION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE 5 GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION, SHALL DEVELOP A 6 STANDARDIZED FORMAT THAT EACH LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL USE TO 7 REPORT DATA TO THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION 8 UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

12 (2) (I) THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME CONTROL AND 13 PREVENTION SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT OF THE ANALYSES AND SUMMARIES OF THE 14 REPORTS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 15 SUBSECTION TO THE GOVERNOR, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AS PROVIDED IN § 16 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, AND EACH LAW ENFORCEMENT 17 AGENCY BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1 EACH YEAR.

(II) EACH REPORT SUBMITTED SHALL INCLUDE THE TOTAL
 NUMBER OF SEARCH WARRANTS EXECUTED BY EACH LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY
 IN COMPARISON TO THOSE EXECUTED BY THE AGENCY'S SWAT TEAM.

(D) (1) IF A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE
 REPORTING PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME
 CONTROL AND PREVENTION SHALL REPORT THE NONCOMPLIANCE TO THE POLICE
 TRAINING COMMISSION.

25 (2) ON RECEIPT OF A REPORT OF NONCOMPLIANCE, THE POLICE 26 TRAINING COMMISSION SHALL CONTACT THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY AND 27 REQUEST THAT THE AGENCY COMPLY WITH THE REQUIRED REPORTING 28 PROVISIONS.

(3) IF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE
REQUIRED REPORTING PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER BEING
CONTACTED BY THE POLICE TRAINING COMMISSION WITH A REQUEST TO COMPLY,

2 WHEN A SWAT TEAM IS DEPLOYED, ONE OR MORE MEMBERS OF THE SWAT 3 TEAM SHALL WEAR A UNIFORM CLEARLY IDENTIFYING THE MEMBER AS A LAW 4 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2016.
