SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (A) THE COURT OF APPEALS SHALL ALLOW AN APPLICANT TO THE BAR OR 17 A LAWYER TO USE A CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD TO PAY:
- 18 **(1)** AN EXAMINATION FEE OR ANY OTHER FEE REQUIRED FOR 19 ADMISSION TO THE BAR; AND
- 20 (2) ANY ANNUAL FEE ASSESSED AGAINST A LAWYER.

1 (B) THE COURT OF APPEALS MAY CHARGE A PROCESSING FEE FOR EACH 2 CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD PAYMENT MADE UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION 3 NOT EXCEEDING THE ACTUAL COST INCURRED IN PROCESSING THE CREDIT OR 4 DEBIT CARD PAYMENT.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2016.
