FOR the purpose of altering a certain provision of law to require the Athletic Trainer Advisory Committee to recommend to the State Board of Physicians approval. modification, or disapproval of individual evaluation and treatment protocols; authorizing, under certain circumstances, an athletic trainer to assume duties under an evaluation and treatment protocol after receiving a certain recommendation from the Committee; providing that certain specialized tasks may only be performed after an athletic trainer receives certain approval from the Board; authorizing the Board to disapprove, under certain circumstances, an evaluation and treatment protocol and specialized tasks included in an evaluation and treatment protocol; requiring the Board, under certain circumstances, to send certain notice to a primary supervising physician and an athletic trainer; requiring an athletic trainer who receives notice of a certain disapproval to cease practicing under a certain evaluation and treatment protocol or performing a certain specialized task; providing that a member of the Board is not civilly liable for certain actions and omissions; making a conforming change; the definition of "practice athletic training" to include instruction to tactical athletes regarding the care and prevention of athletic injuries while engaging in tactical athletic activity; granting, except under certain circumstances, immunity from civil liability to a member of the State Board of Physicians for an act or omission relating to the approval of a certain evaluation and treatment protocol; authorizing an athletic trainer to assume certain duties under an evaluation and treatment protocol on the date of receipt by the Board of a written recommendation of approval from the Athletic Trainer Advisory Committee under certain
