2 Maryland College Collaboration for Student Veterans Commission

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland College Collaboration for Student Veterans 4 Commission; providing for the membership and appointment and terms of members of the Commission; requiring the Commission to elect the chair, vice chair, and $\mathbf{5}$ secretary each year; requiring the Commission to meet a certain number of times 6 7 each year; providing that a member of the Commission may not receive certain 8 compensation, but may receive reimbursement for certain expenses under certain 9 regulations; providing for the duties of the Commission; and generally relating to the 10 Maryland College Collaboration for Student Veterans Commission.

21 (A) THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES EACH YEAR.

22 (B) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:

23 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 24 COMMISSION; BUT

25 (2) MAY RECEIVE REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 26 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

28 **THE COMMISSION SHALL:**

1 (1) WORK TO ENSURE THE EDUCATIONAL SUCCESS OF RETURNING 2 VETERANS, INCLUDING THEIR RECRUITMENT, SUCCESSFUL TRANSITION INTO 3 HIGHER EDUCATION, RETENTION, AND EVENTUAL GRADUATION;

4 (2) FACILITATE THE SHARING OF BEST PRACTICES AMONG 5 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND STATE AGENCIES REGARDING 6 ACADEMIC TRANSITION PROGRAMS AND SUPPORT SERVICES DESIGNED FOR 7 RETURNING VETERANS;

8 (3) WORK WITH INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE 9 TO PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING SERVICES TO VETERANS, AS SET FORTH IN THE 10 COLLEGE COLLABORATION:

(I) AWARENESS OF VETERAN REINTEGRATION CHALLENGES;

12(II)COMMUNICATION AND COORDINATION OF AVAILABLE13VETERAN SERVICES;

14(III) A DESIGNATED "ONE DOOR" OFFICE THAT COORDINATES15VETERAN SERVICES AND SUPPORTS;

- 16 (IV) BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES;
- 17 (V) FINANCIAL AID AND GI BILL SUPPORT SERVICES; AND
- 18 (VI) PEER SUPPORT GROUPS; AND

19(4) PUBLISH AN ANNUAL REPORT AND ANY OTHER MATERIAL THE20COMMISSION CONSIDERS NECESSARY; AND

21(5)SUBMIT THE ANNUAL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN22ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THIS ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 24 October 1, 2016.
