### 2 Maryland College Collaboration for Student Veterans Commission

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland College Collaboration for Student Veterans 4 Commission; providing for the membership and appointment and terms of members  $\mathbf{5}$ of the Commission; requiring the Commission to elect the chair, vice chair, and 6 secretary each year; requiring the Commission to meet a certain number of times 7 each year; providing that a member of the Commission may not receive certain 8 compensation, but may receive reimbursement for certain expenses under certain 9 regulations; providing for the duties of the Commission; and generally relating to the 10 Maryland College Collaboration for Student Veterans Commission.

18(1)THE SECRETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS, OR THE SECRETARY'S19DESIGNEE;

20 (2) THE SECRETARY OF HIGHER EDUCATION, OR THE SECRETARY'S 21 DESIGNEE; AND

22 (3) <u>THE CHANCELLOR OF THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF MARYLAND,</u> 23 OR THE CHANCELLOR'S DESIGNEE;

# 24(4)THE PRESIDENT OF THE MARYLAND INDEPENDENT COLLEGE25AND UNIVERSITY ASSOCIATION, OR THE PRESIDENT'S DESIGNEE;

26(5)THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION OF27COMMUNITY COLLEGES, OR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE; AND

28 (3) (6) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF ANY INSTITUTION OF HIGHER 29 EDUCATION IN THE STATE THAT ELECTS TO PARTICIPATE. 1 (B) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION <u>DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A)(6) OF THIS</u> 3 <u>SECTION</u> FROM A LIST OF THREE QUALIFIED INDIVIDUALS SUBMITTED TO THE 4 GOVERNOR BY THE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION SEEKING TO BE 5 REPRESENTED ON THE COMMISSION.

6 (C) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 2 YEARS.

7 (2) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL 8 A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

10 THE COMMISSION SHALL ELECT ANNUALLY A CHAIR, A VICE CHAIR, AND A 11 SECRETARY FROM AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION.

13 (A) THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES EACH YEAR.

14 **(B) A** MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:

15 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 16 COMMISSION; BUT

17(2) MAY RECEIVE REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE18STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
