19IF THE OWNER OF A RETAIL BUSINESS WITH AN AUTOMATED TELLER MACHINE20LOCATED ON THE PREMISES OF THE BUSINESS HAS KNOWLEDGE THAT THE21AUTOMATED TELLER MACHINE HAS AN ILLEGAL SKIMMING DEVICE INSTALLED ON22OR NEAR IT, THE RETAIL BUSINESS OWNER SHALL:

23(1)POST IN A CONSPICUOUS PLACE ON OR NEAR THE AUTOMATED24TELLER MACHINE A NOTICE THAT WARNS CUSTOMERS OF THE AUTOMATED TELLER



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1 MACHINE THAT IT HAS AN ILLEGAL SKIMMING DEVICE INSTALLED ON OR NEAR IT; 2 AND

3 (2) KEEP THE NOTICE POSTED UNDER ITEM (1) OF THIS SECTION
4 UNTIL THE ILLEGAL SKIMMING DEVICE IS REMOVED FROM THE AUTOMATED TELLER
5 MACHINE BY THE APPROPRIATE ENTITY.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2016.
