## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning
Frederick County - Alcohol Awareness Program - Absence From Licensed Premises
FOR the purpose of authorizing in Frederick County an individual certified by an approved alcohol awareness program to be absent from a licensed premises for a personal or business reason under certain circumstances; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Frederick County.
BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Alcoholic Beverages Section 20–1903 Annotated Code of Maryland (As enacted by Chapter (S.B)(6lr1406) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2016)
SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
Article - Alcoholic Beverages
20–1903.
(a) (1) The individual certified by an approved alcohol awareness program may be absent from the licensed premises for A PERSONAL OR BUSINESS REASON OR an emergency if:
(i) the PERSONAL OR BUSINESS REASON OR emergency meets standards that the Board sets by regulation; and
(ii) the absence lasts for not more than 2 hours.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



- 1 (2) The Board shall require the license holder to keep a log book on the 2 licensed premises that documents each temporary absence, the length of time of the 3 absence, and the reason for the absence, in the form that the Board requires.
- 4 (b) A license holder who violates this section is subject to:
- 5 (1) for a first offense, a \$100 fine; and
- 6 (2) for each subsequent offense, a fine not exceeding \$500 or a suspension 7 or revocation of the license or both.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 9 1, 2016.
