# State Highway Administration – Policy Concerning Sound Barriers Along Highways

FOR the purpose of requiring the State Highway Administration, in collaboration with
county governing bodies, to develop and adopt by regulation a policy concerning
sound barriers along highways in the State; requiring the Administration to conduct
a certain study concerning sound barriers along highways in the State and report its
findings to the Governor and the General Assembly; defining a term; and generally
relating to sound barriers along highways in the State.

# Article – Transportation

18 **8–657.** 

19 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "SOUND BARRIER" MEANS A NATURAL OR AN 20 ARTIFICIAL BARRIER DESIGNED TO REDUCE THE TRANSFER OF SOUND FROM 21 TRAFFIC ALONG A HIGHWAY TO ADJACENT AREAS.

22 (B) THE ADMINISTRATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE LOCAL 23 GOVERNING BODIES OF THE COUNTIES, SHALL DEVELOP AND ADOPT BY

### 1 REGULATION A POLICY CONCERNING SOUND BARRIERS ALONG HIGHWAYS IN THE 2 STATE.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

4 (a) The State Highway Administration shall conduct a study to:

5 (1) evaluate the effectiveness of the Administration's policy concerning 6 sound barriers under the regulations adopted under § 8–657 of the Transportation Article 7 as enacted by the Act, when applied to sound barriers that were installed along highways 8 in the State prior to the adoption of the regulations;

9 (2) determine the portion of the Administration's annual budget that is 10 spent on sound barriers along highways in the State; and

11 (3) evaluate any differences among the counties in the contracts awarded 12 for the construction of sound barriers along highways in the State and determine the costs 13 and benefits of any differences that are noted.

(b) On or before December 1, 2017, the Administration shall report the findings
of the study to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the
General Assembly.

17 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October 1, 2016.

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
