CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Foster Youth Summer Internship Program**

3 FOR the purpose of recodifying and making permanent the Foster Youth Summer
4 Internship Pilot Program; altering the name of the program to be the Foster Youth
5 Summer Internship Program; transferring certain responsibilities relating to the
6 Program to the Secretary of Human Services; requiring the Secretary of Human
7 Resources, in consultation with the Secretary of Budget and Management, to issue
8 a certain report to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the Senate Finance
9 Committee, and the House Appropriations Committee of the General Assembly on
10 or before a certain date; specifying the contents of the report; defining certain terms;
11 providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to internship
12 opportunities for certain foster youth.

5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
6 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

8 3–207.

9 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

10 (2) “Foster youth” means an individual who:

11 (i) is in out-of-home care under the responsibility of the State; or

12 (ii) 1. is an adult under the age of 26 years; and

13 2. was in out-of-home care under the responsibility of the
14 State on the individual’s 18th birthday.

15 (3) “Program” means the Foster Youth Summer Internship Pilot Program
16 established under this section.

17 (b) The Secretary shall:

18 (1) develop and implement a Foster Youth Summer Internship Pilot
19 Program with the assistance of the Secretary of Human Resources and in consultation with
20 the local directors of local departments of social services; and

21 (2) coordinate with State agencies to establish internships in State
22 agencies that are open to participants in the Program.

23 (c) The purpose of the Program is to provide foster youth with training and
24 experience through internships in agencies within the Executive Branch of State
25 government.

26 (d) The Program shall be established in multiple regions of the State.

27 (e) Internships under the Program may be paid or unpaid.

28 (f) A State agency participating in the Program may:

29 (1) specify requirements for internship applicants; and

1 (2) select its interns from among the available applicants.

2 (g) To be eligible to participate in an internship under the Program, an individual
3 must be a foster youth at least 15 years old.

4 (h) On or before October 31, 2015, the Secretary, in consultation with the
5 Secretary of Human Resources, shall report to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee,
6 the Senate Finance Committee, and the House Appropriations Committee of the General
7 Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, on:

8 (1) the number of foster youth participating in the Program;

9 (2) the location and type of internships in the Program;

10 (3) efforts to recruit eligible individuals to participate in the Program; and

11 (4) factors that affect Program participation.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
14 January 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of December
15 31, 2016, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
16 abrogated and of no further force and effect.

19 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
20 INDICATED.

21 (2) “FOSTER YOUTH” MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:

22 (I) IS IN OUT–OF–HOME CARE UNDER THE RESPONSIBILITY OF
23 THE STATE; OR

24 (II) 1. IS AN ADULT UNDER THE AGE OF 26 YEARS; AND

25 2. WAS IN OUT–OF–HOME CARE UNDER THE
26 RESPONSIBILITY OF THE STATE ON THE INDIVIDUAL’S 18TH BIRTHDAY.

27 (3) “PROGRAM” MEANS THE FOSTER YOUTH SUMMER INTERNSHIP
28 PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION.

1 **(B) THE SECRETARY SHALL:**

2 **(1) DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A FOSTER YOUTH SUMMER**
3 **INTERNSHIP PROGRAM WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET**
4 **AND MANAGEMENT AND IN CONSULTATION WITH THE LOCAL DIRECTORS OF LOCAL**
5 **DEPARTMENTS OF SOCIAL SERVICES; AND**

6 **(2) COORDINATE WITH STATE AGENCIES TO ESTABLISH INTERNSHIPS**
7 **IN STATE AGENCIES THAT ARE OPEN TO PARTICIPANTS IN THE PROGRAM.**

8 **(C) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE FOSTER YOUTH WITH**
9 **TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE THROUGH INTERNSHIPS IN AGENCIES WITHIN THE**
10 **EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF STATE GOVERNMENT.**

11 **(D) THE PROGRAM SHALL BE ESTABLISHED IN MULTIPLE REGIONS OF THE**
12 **STATE.**

13 **(E) INTERNSHIPS UNDER THE PROGRAM MAY BE PAID OR UNPAID.**

14 **(F) A STATE AGENCY PARTICIPATING IN THE PROGRAM MAY:**

15 **(1) SPECIFY REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNSHIP APPLICANTS; AND**

16 **(2) SELECT ITS INTERNS FROM AMONG THE AVAILABLE APPLICANTS.**

17 **(G) TO BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN AN INTERNSHIP UNDER THE**
18 **PROGRAM, AN INDIVIDUAL MUST BE A FOSTER YOUTH AT LEAST 15 YEARS OLD.**

19 **(H) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2019, THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION**
20 **WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES, SHALL REPORT TO THE SENATE**
21 **BUDGET AND TAXATION COMMITTEE, THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE, AND THE**
22 **HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN**
23 **ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON:**

24 **(1) THE NUMBER OF FOSTER YOUTH PARTICIPATING IN THE**
25 **PROGRAM;**

26 **(2) THE LOCATION AND TYPE OF INTERNSHIPS IN THE PROGRAM;**

27 **(3) EFFORTS TO RECRUIT ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS TO PARTICIPATE IN**
28 **THE PROGRAM; AND**

29 **(4) FACTORS THAT AFFECT PROGRAM PARTICIPATION.**

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
2 January 1, 2017.
