A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

State Board of Physicians – Naturopathic Doctors – Establishment of Naturopathic Doctors Formulary Council and Naturopathic Formulary

- FOR the purpose of establishing a Naturopathic Doctors Formulary Council within the 4 $\mathbf{5}$ State Board of Physicians; providing for the membership, terms, compensation, 6 chair, and staff the Council; requiring the Council to develop and recommend to the 7 Board a certain formulary, provide certain reviews of the formulary adopted by the 8 Board, and make certain recommendations to the Board; requiring the Board to 9 adopt a certain formulary; authorizing the Board to modify or reject any recommendation of the Council regarding the formulary; requiring a certain 1011 formulary to include certain nonprescription drugs and devices and certain 12prescription drugs and contraceptives; prohibiting a certain formulary from 13 including certain prescription drugs and devices and controlled substances; 14providing that a license authorizes a licensed naturopathic doctor to dispense, order, 15or administer certain natural medicines and nonprescription drugs listed in a certain 16formulary; altering the routes of administration for certain natural medicines and 17nonprescription drugs that a license authorizes a licensee to use; excluding 18 prescription drugs and devices included in the formulary from the prohibition 19against a licensed naturopathic doctor prescribing, dispensing, or administering 20prescription drugs and devices; providing that a license does not authorize a licensed 21naturopathic doctor to prescribe, dispense, or administer certain drugs or devices for 22cosmetic purposes; and generally relating to the establishment of the Naturopathic 23Doctors Formulary Council and naturopathic formulary.

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(I) **NONPRESCRIPTION DRUGS AND DEVICES;**

16 (a) A license authorizes a licensee, consistent with naturopathic education and 17 training and competence demonstrated by passing the naturopathic physician licensing 18 examination, to:

19 (1) Order and perform physical and laboratory examinations for diagnostic 20 purposes, including phlebotomy, clinical laboratory tests, orificial examinations, 21 electrocardiograms with over read by a cardiologist, and physiological function tests;

(2) (2) Order diagnostic imaging studies and interpret the reports of diagnostic
 23 imaging studies;

(3) Dispense or order natural medicines of mineral, animal, or botanical
origin, including food, extracts of food, nutraceuticals, vitamins, amino acids, minerals,
enzymes, botanicals and their extracts, botanical medicines, homeopathic medicines, and
all dietary supplements and nonprescription drugs [as defined by the federal Food, Drug,
and Cosmetic Act] LISTED IN THE FORMULARY that use various routes of administration,
including oral, nasal, auricular, ocular, rectal, vaginal, transdermal, and intramuscular;

(4) Administer natural medicines of mineral, animal, or botanical origin,
 including food, extracts of food, nutraceuticals, vitamins, amino acids, minerals, enzymes,
 botanicals and their extracts, botanical medicines, homeopathic medicines, and all dietary

supplements and nonprescription drugs [as defined by the federal Food, Drug, and
 Cosmetic Act] LISTED IN THE FORMULARY using [transdermal] VARIOUS routes of
 administration, INCLUDING ORAL, NASAL, AURICULAR, OCULAR, RECTAL, VAGINAL,
 TRANSDERMAL, AND INTRAMUSCULAR;

5 (5) Administer or perform hot or cold hydrotherapy, naturopathic physical 6 medicine, electromagnetic energy, and therapeutic exercise for the purpose of providing 7 basic therapeutic care services, except that if a referral to another licensed provider is 8 appropriate for ongoing rehabilitation or habilitation services, the naturopathic doctor shall 9 make the referral;

- 10 (6) Provide health education and health counseling; and
- 11 (7) Perform naturopathic musculoskeletal mobilization.
- 12 (b) A license does not authorize a licensee to:

(1) [Prescribe] EXCEPT FOR A PRESCRIPTION DRUG OR DEVICE
 INCLUDED IN THE FORMULARY UNDER § 14–5F–04.1(D)(1)(II) OR (III) OF THIS
 SUBTITLE, PRESCRIBE, dispense, or administer any prescription drug OR DEVICE;

17 (3) Practice or claim to practice as a medical doctor or physician, an 18 osteopath, a dentist, a podiatrist, an optometrist, a psychologist, a nurse practitioner, a 19 physician assistant, a chiropractor, a physical therapist, an acupuncturist, or any other 20 health care professional unless licensed under this article;

- 21 (4) Use general or spinal anesthetics;
- 22 (5) Administer ionizing radioactive substances for therapeutic purposes;

23 (6) Perform chiropractic adjustments or manipulations that include 24 high-velocity thrusts at or beyond the end range of normal joint motion unless the licensee 25 is also a licensed chiropractor; [or]

26 (7) Perform acupuncture unless the licensee is also a licensed 27 acupuncturist; **OR**

(8) PRESCRIBE, DISPENSE, OR ADMINISTER ANY PRESCRIPTION OR
NONPRESCRIPTION DRUG OR DEVICE LISTED IN THE FORMULARY FOR COSMETIC
PURPOSES.
