# State Board of Physicians – Naturopathic Doctors – Establishment of Naturopathic Doctors Formulary Council and Naturopathic Formulary

4 FOR the purpose of establishing a Naturopathic Doctors Formulary Council within the  $\mathbf{5}$ State Board of Physicians; providing for the membership, terms, compensation, 6 chair, and staff the Council; requiring the Council to develop and recommend to the 7 Board a certain formulary, provide certain reviews of the formulary adopted by the 8 Board, and make certain recommendations to the Board; requiring the Board to 9 adopt a certain formulary; authorizing the Board to modify or reject any 10 recommendation of the Council regarding the formulary; requiring a certain 11 formulary to include certain nonprescription drugs and devices and certain 12 prescription drugs and contraceptives; prohibiting a certain formulary from 13including certain prescription drugs and devices and controlled substances; 14 providing that a license authorizes a licensed naturopathic doctor to dispense, order, 15or administer certain natural medicines and nonprescription drugs listed in a certain 16 formulary; altering the routes of administration for certain natural medicines and 17nonprescription drugs that a license authorizes a license to use; authorizing a 18 licensee to administer auto-injectable epinephrine; excluding prescription drugs and 19 devices included in the formulary from the prohibition against a licensed 20naturopathic doctor prescribing, dispensing, or administering prescription drugs and 21devices; providing that a license does not authorize a licensed naturopathic doctor to 22prescribe, dispense, or administer certain drugs or devices for cosmetic purposes; 23defining certain terms; and generally relating to the establishment of the 24Naturopathic Doctors Formulary Council and naturopathic formulary.
