# 2 Service, Stipends, and Scholarships – Maryland Corps Program – Established

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Corps Program; providing for the purpose 4 of the Program; requiring a certain Board of Directors to administer and manage the  $\mathbf{5}$ Program: providing for the composition of the Board; providing for the appointment, 6 terms, and removal of members of the Board; providing that members of the Board 7may not receive certain compensation but are entitled to certain reimbursement; 8 requiring the Governor's Office on Service and Volunteerism within the Governor's 9 Office of Community Initiatives to provide certain staffing and assistance to the 10 Board and a certain operator; requiring the Board to submit a certain Request for 11 Proposals (RFP) on or before a certain date; requiring the RFP to include certain 12elements and expectations for a certain operator; requiring certain corps participants 13to serve a certain nonprofit or governmental entity for a certain period of time; 14 authorizing certain corps participants to receive certain stipends and certain 15scholarships under certain circumstances; specifying the use of certain scholarships; 16establishing the Maryland Corps Program Fund; specifying the purpose of the Fund; 17requiring the Board to administer the Fund; specifying that the Fund is a continuing, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to a certain provision of law; requiring the State 18 19Treasurer to hold the Fund separately and invest the money in the Fund in a certain 20manner; requiring the Comptroller to account for the Fund; providing for the 21composition and uses of the Fund; prohibiting any unspent portion of the Fund from 22being transferred or used in a certain manner; requiring the Board to prepare certain 23reports annually; authorizing the Fund to be subject to a certain audit; requiring the 24Governor to include certain appropriations providing that funds for the Program will 25be as provided in the State budget in certain fiscal years for certain purposes;
