St. Mary's County - Alcoholic Beverages - Permits, Training, Prohibited Acts, and Violations

4 FOR the purpose of altering the serving size of a sample serving of beer permitted to be served to an individual by a holder of a Class BWTS beer and wine tasting or $\mathbf{5}$ 6 sampling permits license in St. Mary's County; establishing a BWT beer and wine 7 tasting permit in St. Mary's County for a certain purpose; authorizing the Board of 8 License Commissioners for St. Mary's County to issue the permit only to a holder of 9 a certain license; providing for the application and fees for, maximum permit periods, and restrictions associated with the permit; requiring an applicant for an alcoholic 10 beverages license in St. Mary's County to attend certain training within a certain 11 12time after the application is approved; providing that attendance at certain training 13 does not fulfill a certain training requirement; prohibiting a person who operates a 14certain establishment in St. Mary's County without an alcoholic beverage license 15from knowingly allowing a customer to bring alcoholic beverages for consumption

6 (A) WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE BOARD APPROVES AN APPLICATION FOR A 7 LICENSE, THE APPLICANT SHALL ATTEND RESPONSIBLE ALCOHOL SERVICE 8 TRAINING.

9 (B) ATTENDANCE AT THE RESPONSIBLE ALCOHOL SERVICE TRAINING 10 DOES NOT FULFILL THE ALCOHOL AWARENESS TRAINING REQUIREMENT UNDER § 11 4-505 OF THIS ARTICLE.

(a) An establishment not licensed by the Board, at a location under the control orpossession of the establishment, may not:

15 (1) sell or serve alcoholic beverages to a member or guest;

16 (2) keep alcoholic beverages for a member or guest;

17 (3) allow a customer to consume or to be served alcoholic beverages from
18 the supplies that the customer has previously purchased or reserved; or

19 (4) sell, serve, keep, or allow to be consumed setups or other component 20 parts of mixed alcoholic drinks to a member or guest.

(b) A person who operates an establishment for profit that is not licensed under this article may not knowingly allow a customer to bring alcoholic beverages for consumption into **OR ON THE GROUNDS OF** the establishment.

24 (c) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction 25 is subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000.

27 (a) (1) A person who violates a law relating to:

28 (1) licensing the sale of alcoholic beverages is guilty of a misdemeanor and 29 on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000; and

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1 (2) hours or days for the sale of alcoholic beverages is guilty of a 2 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment or a fine not exceeding \$250 or 3 both.

4 (b) For a license violation, the Board may revoke or suspend a license or impose 5 a fine on the license holder or both.

- 6 (2) IF THE BOARD FINDS THAT A PERSON HAS VIOLATED A LAW 7 RELATING TO LICENSING THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, THE BOARD MAY:
- 8 (I) <u>REVOKE OR SUSPEND THE PERSON'S LICENSE;</u>

9 (II) IMPOSE A CIVIL PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000; OR

10(III) BOTH REVOKE OR SUSPEND THE PERSON'S LICENSE AND11IMPOSE A CIVIL PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000.

12 (C) (B) IF AN EMPLOYEE OF A LICENSE HOLDER SELLS ALCOHOLIC 13 BEVERAGES TO AN INDIVIDUAL UNDER THE AGE OF 21 YEARS THE BOARD MAY 14 IMPOSE A FINE ON THE EMPLOYEE NOT EXCEEDING \$500 PER OFFENSE.
