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## A BILL ENTITLED

2 Washington County - Alcoholic Beverages - Hotel and Motel Licenses

FOR the purpose of altering certain conditions under which the Board of License Commissioners of Washington County may issue a certain alcoholic beverages license to the owner of a hotel or motel; requiring the hotel or motel to have certain lobby facilities; requiring the hotel or motel to have a certain ballroom, conference room, or banquet room instead of certain dining facilities; altering the authority of the license holder under the license; authorizing the Board to adopt certain

regulations; and generally relating to an alcoholic beverages license for hotels or

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

31-903. 1 2 There is a Class B beer, wine, and liquor [(on- and off-sale)] (ON-SALE) hotel 3 and restaurant license. 4 (b) The Board may issue the license to the owner of a hotel **OR MOTEL** that: 5 (1) is in a building at least three stories tall that was originally constructed 6 for hotel OR MOTEL purposes; 7 (2)has a capital investment of at least \$500,000; and 8 (3)contains: 9 (i) at least one passenger elevator; 10 (ii) at least 100 rooms to accommodate the public; [and] 11 (III) A LOBBY WITH A REGISTRATION AND MAIL DESK AND 12 **SEATING FACILITIES; AND** 13 [(iii)] (IV) [a dining room with facilities for preparing and serving regular meals for at least 125 individuals at one seating A BALLROOM, CONFERENCE 14 15 ROOM, OR BANQUET ROOM. 16 The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at a 17 hotel or restaurant at retail at the place described in the license, for [on- and off-premises] 18 **ON-PREMISES** consumption: 19 **(1)** THROUGH ROOM SERVICE OR OTHERWISE TO REGISTERED 20**GUESTS; OR** 21 **(2)** BY THE GLASS, BOTTLE, OR CAN TO INDIVIDUALS ATTENDING AN 22EVENT IN A BALLROOM, CONFERENCE ROOM, OR BANQUET ROOM. 23 (d) The EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD 24UNDER SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION, THE license holder may sell beer, wine, and 25liquor during the hours and days as set out for a Class B beer, wine, and liquor [(on- and off-sale)] (ON-SALE) license under [§ 31–2004(b)] § 31–2004(C) of this title. 26 27 The annual license fee is \$1,000. (e) (1)

The fee for a Sunday permit is \$250.

1 **(F)** THE BOARD MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION. 2 **INCLUDING REGULATIONS THAT:** PROVIDE FOR THE MANNER OF DISPENSING BEER, WINE, AND 3 **(1)** 4 LIQUOR UNDER THE LICENSE; **(2)** 5 PROVIDE FOR THE HOURS AND DAYS OF SALE; AND 6 **(3)** LIMIT THE QUANTITY OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES THAT MAY BE SOLD TO AN INDIVIDUAL AS A SINGLE SERVING OR DURING A 24-HOUR PERIOD. 7 8 31-1903. 9 The license holder or an individual designated by the license holder who (a) (1) 10 is employed in a supervisory capacity shall: 11 (i) be certified by an approved alcohol awareness program; and 12 except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, be present (ii) on the licensed premises during the hours in which alcoholic beverages may be sold. 13 14 The license holder or individual specified in paragraph (1) of this 15 subsection may be absent from the licensed premises for a personal or business reason or 16 an emergency if the absence lasts for not more than 2 hours. 17 The Board shall require the license holder to keep a log book on the licensed premises that documents each temporary absence, the length of time of the 18 absence, and the reason for the absence, in the form that the Board requires. 19 20 (b) A license holder who violates this section is subject to: 21(1) for a first offense, a \$100 fine; and 22 for each subsequent offense, a fine not exceeding \$500 or a suspension (2)23or revocation of the license or both. 24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 25 1, 2016.
