1 AN ACT concerning

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## <u>Frederick County –</u> Linking Youth to New Experiences (LYNX) High School – <del>Pilot Program</del>

FOR the purpose of establishing the Linking Youth to New Experiences (LYNX) High School <del>pilot program</del> at a certain high school in Frederick County; providing that the LYNX High School pilot program is a public school under the authority and supervision of the Frederick County Board of Education and the Frederick County Superintendent of Schools; providing for the purpose of the LYNX High School pilot program; requiring the County Superintendent, on or before a certain date, to develop and submit to the State Board of Education for review county board of education for approval a certain plan that describes certain items; requiring the county board to approve the plan on or before a certain date; requiring the County Superintendent to submit a certain plan to the State Board of Education for review; requiring the State Board county board to consult with the County Superintendent after a certain plan is received to ensure that the plan meets certain requirements; requiring the State Board to grant the LYNX High School pilot program a waiver from certain regulations within a certain period of time in accordance with certain provisions of law and regulation subject to certain exceptions; exempting the LYNX High School pilot program from certain provisions of law relating to student assessments prohibiting the State Board from granting certain waivers; requiring certain elements of certain waivers to be subject to certain provisions of law; requiring, after the granting of certain waivers, the State Board and the County Superintendent to meet with representatives of the Apprenticeship and Training Council and the Division of Labor and Industry in the Department of Labor,
