A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Creation of a State Debt – Montgomery County – Torah School of Greater 3 Washington

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$300,000, the $\mathbf{5}$ proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of The Torah School of 6 Greater Washington, Inc. for certain development or improvement purposes; 7 providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the 8 grantee provide and expend a matching fund; prohibiting the use of the loan proceeds 9 or matching fund for sectarian religious purposes; establishing a deadline for the encumbrance or expenditure of the loan proceeds; and providing generally for the 1011 issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,13 That:

14The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on (1)behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Montgomery 15County – Torah School of Greater Washington Loan of 2016 in a total principal amount 1617equal to the lesser of (i) \$300,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided in accordance with Section 1(5) below. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and 18 19delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public 20Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 and 218–131.2 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a
single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under
§ 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

25 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and 26 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the 27 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on

the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees: as a grant to the Board of Directors of The Torah School of Greater Washington, Inc. (referred to hereafter in this Act as "the grantee") for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital equipping of the Torah School of Greater Washington, located in Montgomery County.

7 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in rate 8 and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and when due 9 and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the date of 10 issuance of the bonds.

11 Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the (5)12purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a matching 13fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, 14from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may 15consist of real property or in kind contributions. The fund may consist of funds expended 16 prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching 17fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works 18shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee has until June 1, 19 2018, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that a matching fund 20will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact and 21the amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan equal 22to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. 23Any amount of the loan in excess of the amount of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works shall be canceled and be of no further effect. 24

25(6)No portion of the proceeds of the loan or any of the matching funds may be 26used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in connection with the design, 27acquisition, or construction of any building used or to be used as a place of sectarian 28religious worship or instruction, or in connection with any program or department of 29divinity for any religious denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, the 30 grantee shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that none of the proceeds of the 31loan or any matching funds have been or are being used for a purpose prohibited by this 32Act.

(7) The proceeds of the loan must be expended or encumbered by the Board of Public Works for the purposes provided in this Act no later than June 1, 2023. If any funds authorized by this Act remain unexpended or unencumbered after June 1, 2023, the amount of the unencumbered or unexpended authorization shall be canceled and be of no further effect. If bonds have been issued for the loan, the amount of unexpended or unencumbered bond proceeds shall be disposed of as provided in § 8–129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

40 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 41 1, 2016.
