State Wetlands License - Temporary Installation of a Boat Canopy - Exemption

This bill exempts the temporary installation of a boat canopy, from April 1 through October 1 annually, from the requirement to obtain a license to dredge or fill on State wetlands if the canopy (1) is installed on a boat lift that is attached to a residential pier in water that is at least 6 feet deep at mean low water and (2) is no more than 30 feet in length and 10 feet in width.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill is not anticipated to materially affect State operations or finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Wetlands and Waterways Program within the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) administers a statewide program for the management, conservation, and protection of Maryland's tidal wetlands and nontidal wetlands and waterways, including the 100-year floodplain. Permits granted for work in privately owned wetlands are issued by MDE; licenses granted for work in State-owned wetlands are issued by the Board of Public Works.

In general, a person is prohibited from dredging or filling on State wetlands without a license. However, this requirement does not apply to (1) dredging and filling being conducted as of July 1, 1970, under specified circumstances; (2) dredging of seafood

products by a licensed operator, harvesting of seaweed, and approved mosquito control and abatement; (3) approved improvement of wildlife habitat or agricultural drainage ditches; (4) routine maintenance or repair of existing bulkheads, under certain restrictions; or (5) aquaculture activities occurring under a specified lease issued by the Department of Natural Resources.

Under tidal wetlands regulations, the construction of a new boathouse, other than at a commercial marina, in or over State or private wetlands is prohibited. However, a person may conduct routine repair and maintenance of existing boathouses without a license or permit if there is no increase in width, length, height, or channel-ward encroachment.
