The Park directly serves the surrounding communities of Hideaway, Clocktower Crossing, Spring Breeze and Wood Valley but is also used for youth sports by the Department and other sports organizations.

A recently opened playground was destroyed by arson in May. The arsonist was apprehended and the County is replacing and relocating the playground including a sunshade. The requested funds will be used to design, re-construct and equipping of a basketball court, resurface and extend an existing pathway to allow a safe pedestrian connection from the
