Our goal is to be able to fill the gaps of within these partnerships, and allow for continuous collaboration in order to better serve the dental needs of Frederick County.

Unfortunately, without appropriate access for these patients, they end up as frequent utilizers of the ED without addressing the actual dental need. The providers in the community are not currently able to meet the demand needed to significantly reduce this inappropriate utilization.
