10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)								

Pocomoke City owns the building and the Delmarva Discovery Center & Museum owns the contents and exhibits. We work together in partnership to increase tourism to Pocomoke City and southern Worcester County. The Discovery Center was formed to be a teaching, living museum and is a 16,000 square foot building full of hands-on and interactive educational opportunities. Education is our niche. We have signed MOU's (memorandum of understandings) with Worcester, Wicomico & Somerset County Board of Educations. They send every third grader to the Discovery Center as well as either every sixth or every seventh graders.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

We will be installing a large handicap accessible Touch Tank which will be included in admission. It will be large enough to hold a classroom of children at once. The Discovery Center is open 7 days a week (Mon-Sat form 10 am - 4 pm, and Sun from noon - 4 pm). We want to provide more opportunities for public, private & homeschool groups by building a fabulous Touch Tank. Otherwise they have to take an expensive and time consuming bus trip across the Bay for this opportunity. This is a cost savings to school & provides better opportunities for the students, and is a truly win-win situation. Elementary & middle schools often do not have the physical space or financial means to build a science lab.

28. Comments

Most schools on the Eastern Shore have a hard time paying transportation expenses to travel 2-2 1/2 hours to the other side of the Bay. We have worked hard to develop partnerships and toured the National Aquarium in Baltimore extensively to find out how we can realistically build our Touch Tank.

The Discovery Center is committed to making the Tank handicap accessible, and will also make the rest of the building accessible as funds allow. Our Board and Staff feel that not only is it the right thing to do, but practically speaking it increases our market. We realize the "heads to beds" keeps visitor longer in Worcester County and senior tours, families, and vacationers will enjoy it.

Bad weather days often find people leaving Worcester County and we take seriously our role in keeping guests in the area.

We have identified 14 animals that our guests can touch, experience and learn about. Some of the animals include horseshoe crabs, flounder, whelks, skates, rays, moon snail and sea stars. The Discovery Center is open seven days a week; Monday through Saturday from 10 am until 4 pm, and Sunday from noon until 4 pm.

We provide a free After School Academy two days a week to Pocomoke Middle School an offer Mommy & Me (& Daddy too) programs.
