10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The MSBC Five Star Program, Inc., an IRS 501(c)(3) Community Development Corporation, (CDC) began in 2001 as a partner in West Baltimore County working with community organizations in the enhancement of residents' lives. The goal of the MSBC Five Star Program, Inc. is to meet and support the needs of the community through outreach efforts, support services and community programs and activities. Located at 6665 Security Blvd., the CDC has served thousands of community members with social, educational, physical and mental health needs. Having oversight of The Renaissance Counseling Center, Morning Star Daycare Center, and having managed a Teenage Abstinence Program and Transitional Housing Project, the CDC has a solid track record of community outreach and service. Its reach is limited only by current resources and the need for more space.
