10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

NCLF was founded in 1991 as the private arm of a partnership with Montgomery County to fund the operating expenses for the Noyes Children's Library, the oldest public library in the DC area. Its purpose is (1) to ensure the continuation of Noyes and (2) to provide enhanced library and literacy services to young children. NCLF reaches thousands of Marylanders with special events such as storybook parades, readings by children's authors, read-a-thons, book illustration workshops, theater workshops, and Penny Theater shows. Honors include a prestigious grant in 2012 from the American Physical Society for a science literacy program, recognition as a Point of Light by the national Points of Light Foundation, proclamations from MD and Mont. Co. for extraordinary service to the community, and widespread support among business and civic organizations.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Make MORE Noyes project will provide needed renovations, triple floor space, and make Noyes a model of universal access, exceeding ADA standards to achieve true inclusion. The design includes a storybook tower to house a three-story elevator, and a glass-walled passageway that joins the tower to the library so that the historic building maintains its original shape and size. The upper and lower levels will be finished to provide space for programs, Noyes history displays, exhibits, a stage, community meetings, staff areas, two ADA restrooms, and storage. The existing main level will continue as the main reading room, with literacy play areas. The new space and accessibility will enable Noyes to (1) help lead regional and national efforts to promote early literacy; (2) provide inclusive programming for persons with disabilities; and (3) establish new partnerships to help advance childrens literature and library services.

Question 11.

The Make MORE Noyes campaign is already generating public enthusiasm and benefits, The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) has partnered with the community to design and build a Childrens Reading Garden adjacent to Noyes, on the grounds of the historic Warner Mansion. The Warner property is now also hosting family events such as one held in October 2015 that attracted approximately 400 children and adults from a wide geographic area and introduced Noyes to many new families.

Make MORE Noyes is a joint project of the Noyes Children's Library Foundation and Montgomery County, MD. Since Montgomery County owns the Noyes Library property, State bond funds will ultimately be sent directly to the county government. However, the match will be a raised by the Foundation and any state monies awarded through bond are viewed within the public-private partnership as contributions to the Foundation commitment of \$1.6 million to the \$3.1 million project.
