<b>10. Description and Purpose of Organization</b> (Limit length to visible area)								

The Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum is a world-class maritime museum dedicated to preserving and exploring the history, environment, and people of the Chesapeake Bay. It was founded in 1965 on Navy Point in St. Michaels. The Museums 18-acre waterfront campus was once the site of a busy complex of seafood packing houses, docks, and workboats.

Over the past 50 years, the Museum has grown from one historic building with a handful of artifacts to an 18-acre campus consisting of 19 buildings, including 9 exhibition buildings, a members-only marina, and more than 60,000 objects in its collection. The Museums collection of Chesapeake Bay watercraft is the largest in existence numbering about 85 boats. 11 of the collections largest vessels are on floating display at the Museums docks. A landmark on the campus, the 1879 Hooper Strait Lighthouse was relocated to its new home on Navy Point in 1966. CBMM is the only museum devoted to interpreting the entire maritime region of the Bay. ## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

The Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum (CBMM) has nine historic and ten non-historic buildings, the exteriors of which are all degraded and require restoration. Nine of these buildings are used as exhibition space. Two exhibition buildings require new roofs; one needs complete repurposing and renovation; one collections storage building lacks security and fire suppression; one building has no climate control and is subject to excessive mold; and the historic Tilghman Island Bridge needs resurfacing. Also, CBMM has an antiquated fire and theft alarm system. This \$1.5 million single phase project will be developed as a public-private partnership between CBMM and the State.

## 28. Comments

CBMM is the only museum in the world devoted to interpreting the entire maritime region of the Bay and houses the nations most complete collection of Chesapeake Bay artifacts, visual arts, and indigenous water craft. Interpretive exhibitions and public programs cover Chesapeake Bay maritime history and culture, watercraft and boat building traditions, navigation, waterfowling, seafood harvesting, and recreation. The campus includes a working boatyard and marine railway, a floating fleet, an interactive waterman's wharf, and historic structures. Programs include school tours, day camps, Apprentice for a Day (boatbuilding), demonstrations and classes, lectures, sailing and boating activities, and festivals.

CBMM serves a large and diverse cross section of the public through its many and varied activities and reaches an annual visitation of nearly 70,000 national and international visitors. CBMM provides experiential learning programs for grades pre-K - 12th grade, with over 3,
