Unified Efforts, Inc. is an organization owned and operated by a Baltimore native, former Baltimore City Police Detective, and Community Police Officer. The building's owner is a Baltimore City native, retired USPS worker of 42 years, Baltimore City College graduate and is committed to providing his property for such an initiative designed to employ and help in the reduction of violence. Our Youth Violence Prevention and Gang Prevention programs have been utilized by Baltimore City Recreation and Park, s for the past four years, with successes that range from students receiving civic recognition from Baltimore City's Fire and Police Departments: Our students have been awarded the prestigious "Police and Fire Chief for the Day" and Baltimore's Mayor "Change Maker" Awards for their violence prevention contributions. UE's sought to physically locate to Baltimore City's Penn-North community prior to last spring's uprising. In mid April 2015, UE, met with the President of the Penn-North Community Association (Ms. Annie Hall), to discuss aspirations of UE bringing an Out of School Youth Center to 1604 W. North Ave. Ms. Annie Hall/President endorsed, approved and provided UE with her written letter of support to Baltimore's Board of Municipal and Zoning. On June 22, 2015 we were approved, by Zoning, to convert 1604 W. North Avenue from a multi-residential to a youth center. On Nov. 18, 2015 DHCD/Md. Division of Construction & Building Inspection's filing fee application was executed. Other written community support came from several faith-based supporters, Pastors Julienne Rivera, (Fulton Baptist Church) and Rev. Vaughn Green (Gethsemane Baptist Church), its residents, area businesses and just as importantly professed gang associates (which related that they welcome our organization - w/hopes of seeking lawful employment and to provide supervised activities that "can save our younger brothers and sisters". This particular disenfranchised group has assisted us in a "clean-up" activity we conducted last summer with much success and appreciation. Conceptual architectural designs have been completed by the Neighborhood Design Center. The permittables architectural designs are to be produced by The Sandra Vicchio & Associates, LLC. UE will be in a position to provide new employment opportunities and to be considered as an emerging market for the citizenry of the state of Maryland. We are strategically located less than 300 feet from Maryland's Metro-Subway Upton station, MTA buses run north, south, east and westbound seven days a week. UE is conveniently located and encourages its employees, students and all other visitors and/or participants to utilize public transportation. Also, those who are within walking distance will be able to stay in a community they have come to love, appreciate and call "home". UE's project is shovel ready! This is largely as a result from our many supporters. Whiting-Turner General Contractor and our Architectural Design Team/Sandra Vicchio & Associates, LLC. We are that change in which the community, Baltimore and the state of Maryland has been seeking - We are indeed "Unified" and it will take all of our "Efforts" to help elevate, encourage and provide long-term, generational and sustainable assistance that will help a community that has contributed to this state with its rich historical contributions, in which its reach spans our entire free state, and is forever deserving of our resources.
