The Arc Prince George's is the second largest Arc chapter in the State of Maryland. It offers a wide array of services to more than 3,500 individuals and families each year. Four divisions deliver services that match each person or family's individuals needs and ensure that people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) receive the skills, access, and information they need to participate as full citizens in their communities.

Our plans for the coming year are to continue to meet the needs of people with I/DD in Prince Georges County by delivering high-quality programming that supports their independence and facilitates full community inclusion. In 2014, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services issued a federal mandate with the purpose to ensure that people with I/DD receive services that are integrated in and support full access to the greater community. This includes opportunities to seek employment in competitive and integrated settings, engage in community life, control personal resources and receive services in the community. The Arc is working hard to meet the federal requirements by 2017 (the deadline is 2019); transforming a typical day into one where we facilitate a person's goals, preferences, and needs in inclusive community settings.

Over the last couple of years, The Arc has not had the resources to address some pertinent needs. This request will help position us for long-term success and ensure we sustain critical services of the highest quality, in a safe environment, while supporting organizational growth so that we can provide more comprehensive services.
