The Park Planning & Stewardship Division works to support the Department of Parks through a comprehensive park and trail planning program for the more than 150 miles of trails in the county. The construction of a trail connection and repair work on the Western Piedmont Trail is in support of the mission of M-NCPPC Montgomery Parks and its Park Planning and Stewardship program.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Western Piedmont Trail is a 2.19 mile natural surface trail in Little Bennett Regional Park, which is MNCPPCs largest natural park area. This park contains non-tidal wetlands of special state concern and unique plants and animals, making it one of M-NCPPC's best natural areas. This park offers over 23 miles of natural surface trails and is easily one of the most scenic and desired areas in the county for a relatively remote but easily walkable area to picnic, explore, and enjoy the environment in its natural state. Due to large storms in the area over the last 2 years, the proposed project site of Western Piedmont Trail has become impassable. This project will create connectivity from Clarksburg Road to Frederick Road (MD-355) by installing a bridge (up to 80 ft.), completing streambank stabilization and repairs, installing 2-3 instream structures for streambed stability, and also restoring essential habitat that will promote increased stream tributary health.

Thousands and thousands of visitors come to Little Bennett Regional Park every year to enjoy

hiking, cycling, birding, camping, fishing, horseback riding, plant walks, picnicking, interpretive programs and golf.

Western Piedmont Trail is an East-West trail that traverses the park and runs parallel to Little Bennett Creek. The trail was designed to serve as a critical link between the community of Damascus and the Seneca Creek Greenway to the east and Sugarloaf Mountain to the west. It is a multi-use trail, open to all users, and provides many connections to all of the other trails in the park.

However, severe storms throughout the past two years have caused damage in our parks and on trails, specifically Western Piedmont Trail which has become impassable in spots because of the storm damage.

This project will restore one of the key connection points along the trail which is currently impassable because of storm damage and flooding. The installation of a bridge (up to 80 ft.) will allow users to cross over the flooded area. This new bridge will provide a more environmentally friendly crossing of this third order stream which is Little Bennett Creek. Repair and restoration efforts will include streambank stabilization and streambed stability using instream structures. These enhancements will prevent the loss of land, storm flow, and the loss of stream bank vegetation, while providing more opportunity for increasing instream habitat and stream health in order to stabilize the ecosystem in the watershed. Additional benefits include reducing sediment loads to streams due to erosion, and maintaining the capacity of the stream channel. Ultimately, this project will improve the stream and provide environmental benefits to the surrounding area, along with improving access to increase user opportunities to enjoy park and recreational activities.
