A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Constitutional Convention – Approval by Majority of Voters Voting on the Question – Requirement

FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution requiring the
General Assembly to provide by law for the assembly of a constitutional convention
if a majority of voters voting on the question of whether to call a convention, rather
than a majority of voters at the election or elections, vote for a convention; and
submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State for their adoption or
rejection.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses concurring), That it be
 proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

Article XIV – Amendments to the Constitution

18 It shall be the duty of the General Assembly to provide by Law for taking, at the 19 general election to be held in the year nineteen hundred and seventy, and every twenty 20years thereafter, the sense of the People in regard to calling a Convention for altering this 21Constitution; and if a majority of voters VOTING ON THE QUESTION OF WHETHER TO 22CALL A CONVENTION at [such] THE election or elections shall vote for a Convention, the 23General Assembly, at its next session, shall provide by Law for the assembling of such 24convention, and for the election of Delegates thereto. Each County, and Legislative District 25of the City of Baltimore, shall have in such Convention a number of Delegates equal to its

1 representation in both Houses at the time at which the Convention is called. But any 2 Constitution, or change, or amendment of the existing Constitution, which may be adopted 3 by such Convention, shall be submitted to the voters of this State, and shall have no effect 4 unless the same shall have been adopted by a majority of the voters voting thereon.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 6 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act affects 7 multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland 8 Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.

9 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section 10 proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the 11 gualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November 2018 for 12their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that 13general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional 1415Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. 16 Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and 17against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, 18 and further proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.
